1. In 1988, Vice-President George Bush was elected President of the United States. His running mate, Dan Quayle, was subject to major controversy.
2. It was one of the biggest marriages of the year. Heavyweight boxer Mike Tyson married actress Robin Givens. But the stormy marriage lasted less than a year.
3. Amid tears and grief, thousands of people who have died of AIDS were memorialized in October in ceremonies centered on a huge quilt that was made from friends and family members of the victims. Each of the panels were three feet by six feet and all 50 states and a dozen foreign countries were represented in the 375,000 square foot quilt.
4. It became an international effort of good will. Russian and American rescuers cut through the ice in Alaska to save two California gray whales. The whales were trapped in the ice for more than three weeks.
5. Forest fires spread throughout the western part of the country in the summer of 1988, destroying millions of acres of national parkland. The most heavily damaged was Yellowstone National Park.
6. The 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul, South Korea opened with a dramatic and dazzling ceremony.
7. The shuttle Discovery blasted into orbit in September, the first space flight since the shuttle Challenge mission ended tragically 73 seconds after liftoff on January 28, 1988.
8. The summer of 1988 was hit with the worst drought in many years. Throughout the midwest, farmers watched helplessly as their crops went dry.




1. Canadian Ben Johnson won the gold medal in the 100-meter race in the 1988 Summer Olympics but was later disqualified after traces of an anabolic steroid was found in his system.
2. Gretchen Elizabeth Carlson erupted in tears as her name was announced as Miss America 1989.
3. The Dodgers captured their sixth World Series title in October with a 5-2 victory over the Oakland A's in the fifth game of the series.
4. Hurricane Gilbert rose out of the Caribbean like a giant wind storm in late September.
5. The stars of the 1988 Summer Olympics, clockwise from the top: diver Greg Louganis, track and field star Carl Lewis, track star Florence Griffith Joyner and swimmer Matt Biondi. Together, these athletes brought home 12 gold medals, 3 silver and 1 bronze.
6. President Ronald Reagan and Soviet Leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev worked for several years to bring the two countries together. After a treaty was signed to eliminate certain nuclear weapons, 1988 was the year the efforts of these two leaders went into effect.
7. The Democrats went to Atlanta in the summer of 1988, and decided on Michael Dukakis to be its candidate for President on the United States. He decided to pick Lloyd Bentsen as his running mate.



DAWGS GO TO REGIONAL TOURNAMENT

GLEASON BEATS DRESDEN 58-57

Last Thursday night, in the Lady Pacer Gym at the University of Tennessee at Martin, the Gleason Bulldogs won the biggest game of their season. Coming into the District 15A tournament with only two wins for the year (over Palmersville), and ranked sixth in the district, they had to play county rival and third ranked Dresden in the first round. The Bulldogs have not gone to a Regional tournament as participants since 1969, while the Lions have not missed one in a long time. Only three years ago, Dresden played one game at Vanderbilt in the state tournament.

This year and in this game, it came down to who wanted to win the most. The officials called numerous fouls on both teams, but the Lions received more than the Bulldogs. Both teams had to bench starters early due to foul trouble. The Lions had substitutes with a fair amount of experience to put in, the Bulldogs did not. The Lions placed three players in double figures, the Bulldogs only two. The Lions hit better from outside, the Bulldogs got more at the line. The Lions missed enough at the line to have gained the win, but the Bulldogs could have had the win earlier if they had hit a few more. One thing is certain, it was perhaps the best game of the tournament with both teams wanting the win and it went to final second before a winner could be determined.

The two teams began evenly with the Lions Michael Wilson and Troy Doster each hitting a three pointer and Gleason's Eric Belew hitting two. A single shot at the line by Mike Snider put the Bulldogs up by one after the first eight minutes of play. Belew led all scorers as he scored ten for the Bulldogs. Snider added three and Brian Arnold two. Wilson and Doster led the Lions with five each and Brad Bynum scored two. At the end of one, Gleason held a slim 15-14 lead. The second quarter, the Bulldogs continued to score well and built an even larger lead over the Lions. Belew and Snider each scored six for the Bulldogs. Chip Grinder threw in a three pointer and Nicky Bowers contributed two. Doster led the Lions with four. Wilson and Derrick Williams contributed three each and Bynum two. At the half, Gleason led 32-26. The Bulldogs went into the dressing room believing they could win this game and the Lions knew they would have to come back out and get the jump to win.



As the third quarter began, the Lions did get the jump and pulled out front on a two pointer by Doster with just under four and a half minutes remaining on the clock. Williams led all scorers as he hit nine points for the Lions. Doster contributed six and Wilson four. The Bulldogs were led by Belew with six. Snider scored four and Grinder two. After three full quarters of play, Dresden led 46-44. The final quarter, both teams tried to gain the upper hand, but the score continued to be either tied or one team then the other leading by one or two points. The Lions did get an advantage with about a minute remaining in the game, but Belew stole the ball twice and made layups that put the Bulldogs in a 57-57 tie with Dresden. With six seconds remaining on the clock, Dresden's Wilson went to the line for a one and one. He hit the front end and put the Lions ahead 58-57. Belew rebounded the missed second shot and ran the length of the floor for a layup. He was fouled just as he released the ball on the final buzzer. After determining that time was indeed up, the officials placed Belew on the line to shoot two. As Dresden fans and players stood and sat in stunned silence and then loudly tried to distract Belew's concentration, Belew hit the first shot and tied the game at 58-58. Getting position for a second time, he calmly put the second one in for the win. Gleason won the game 59-58. Belew led all scorers with nine points. Arnold contributed four very important points at the line and Snider one. The Lions were led by Wilson with nine, Doster scored two, Bynum two, and Keith Turner one. Both teams and their fans will long remember this game and perhaps play it over again and again in their minds. Both teams played with a lot of determination and displayed excellent sportsmanship. Both teams wanted the win, but the Bulldogs wanted it a little bit more.








